<p>1. Will BPCA accept the Proposer's RFP response if the Proposer's legal department determines that the Proposer is unable to execute all of BPCA's clauses/required documents?</p>	<p>Proposals will be accepted, assuming the proposal is not disqualified for any other reason. The contract exceptions contained in the proposal will be reviewed and may be considered by the evaluation committee for this procurement.</p> <p>Note that acceptance of a proposal by BPCA does not constitute acceptance of any of the contract exceptions noted in any proposal.</p>
<p>2. Will BPCA accept the Proposer's RFP response if the Proposer's legal department determines that the Proposer needs to modify some of BPCA's clauses/required documents prior to executing them?</p> <p>If BPCA will accept modified clauses/required documents, does BPCA need to review the modifications in advance of the Proposer's final submission of the RFP?</p>	<p>See response to Question 1 above. Proposers are not be required to pre-submit any exceptions to the contract terms. They should be clearly stated in the Proposer's submission in response to the RFP.</p>
