Pedestrian Crosswalks: *Ok.*

Vehicle Traffic/Conflicts:

May need more traffic lights as cars are speeding down South End Ave - often lost, or looking for parking - not giving pedestrians the "right of way"

Taxis, Black Cars, Buses:

*We need access to Taxi stand and taxi services.
Tourist buses should not be allowed to come through the small streets of BPC and they should not be here to park or idel.*

Bicycles: *There are absolutely no restrictions on bikes !!!
