

### CitiBike Valet Service in BPC – Pilot

- Instituted in August @ West & Chambers Street CitiBike Station among program's busiest (more than 27,000 combined trips in July)
- Citi Bike employees stationed at docking station on weekdays from 7:30am to 7:30pm
- Pilot program ended November 4




### **HOW WAGNER PARK COULD BE IMPROVED**




66 Being able to walk my dog along the water and sit in the quiet of the park would be a reason to visit Wagner park more often.

- Toilet facilities may be too large








### Establishing a Continuous Floor Barrier – Superstorm Sandy Inundation



#### Minimum First Floor Elevation EL+15.5'





#### **Building Issues**


#### Not Resilient

- Code upgrades required
- Maintenance operations need more and better space
- Public access, especially ADA access to the upper level is difficult
- Building systems and envelope need major overhaul
- Restrooms are oversized and need to be reconfigured
- Not achieving food & beverage potential
- Due to the number and extent of deficiencies and potential modification cost, replacement of building should be considered







#### Recommended Goals


- Use the property to provide resiliency protection for upland areas, without limiting public access and views
