Completion of 100% design and environmental review, and the start of construction preparation for the South Battery Park City Resiliency Project.




Completion of construction for the Ball Fields Resiliency Project.









Budget Framework Reminder

- BPCA collects revenues on behalf of the City of New York.
- The majority of revenues are from PILOT, based on real estate property assessments set by the City.
- BPCA funds its operating expenses and debt service first from these revenues to maintain the neighborhood the rest flow through to the City.
- BPCA has an obligation to maintain this neighborhood through its day to day operations and capital work and to provide funds to the City for important public services.






FY23 Budget: 44% of revenue is from commercial buildings





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
FY23 Budget: 81% of revenue is from PILOT




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*CFM, Retail, Transaction Payments
