NEIGHBORHOOD & PROJECT UPDATES:

- **COVID-19 Vaccine** Get vaccinated and stay up to date with all recommended doses. Ι.
 - All New Yorkers 6 months and older should get vaccinated and get their booster dose when eligible.

III. Operation Pumpkin Drop



IV. NWBPCR Public Scoping Meeting



- The Scoping Period, which runs through December 2, 2022, is the first step in the environmental review process for North/West Battery Park City Resiliency Project.
- During the Scoping Period, BPCA will collect verbal and written comments from the public that will contribute to the project team's evaluation of what the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) should include.



- On October 19, 2022, BPCA published a <u>Draft Scoping Document</u> to start the scoping process. The document includes information about:
 - ✓ The project's purpose and need
 - ✓ Project elements BPCA will consider during the project, and project schedule
 - ✓ Alternatives that will be studied in the EIS
- <u>We Want to Hear from You</u>: Join us <u>Wednesday, November 16</u> from 5-8PM virtually or in-person at Stuyvesant High School from. BPCA will make a brief presentation about the project and scoping process, and attendees may register to make a 3-minute verbal comment and/or submit their comments in writing. All comments received during the Scoping Period will be addressed in the final scoping document.

V. BPC Temporary Playspace Initiative

- In September, BPCA announced a public engagement effort to develop concepts for the activation of open public space across the street from Wagner Park during South Battery Park City Resiliency Project construction.
- Measuring more than 24,000 square feet from Battery Place to Third Place along the Hudson River Greenway, the currently-hardscaped space offers an array of potential opportunities for use by residents and visitors of all ages.



- BPCA working with Community Board 1 and community groups to identify ideas about the programming, furniture, fixtures, and equipment desired to activate this area in line with the community's vision.

 Opening Celebration for Justice Reflected – Saturday, November 12, 3PM @ at Esplanade Plaza Wall. Critically-acclaimed artist James "Yaya" Hough has created glass art panels filled with images that comment on social justice and encourage empathy for all humanity. The artist describes this threepart work as "a visual journey forged by my experiences and observations," which arise from serving 27-years in prison. He was released in 2019, after the Supreme Court



ruled in 2012 that life sentences for minors – as Hough was when he was convicted – were unconstitutional. Hough has since dedicated his practice to raising awareness of the impact of mass incarceration on communities, families, and society as a whole. The temporary installation will be on-display for one year.

IX. COMMUNITY REMINDER – Manhattan Weekly Resurfacing Schedule

- Like all infrastructure, roadways deteriorate over time due to wear and tear from use, from the weathering by heat, freezing and thawing, and precipitation. Resurfacing and reconstruction is determined by a multitude of factors. The NYC Department of Transportation conducts regular inspections to assess pavement conditions, and assigns ratings based on the overall condition, patching, and cracking.


