NEIGHBORHOOD & PROJECT UPDATES:

- I. Get the Facts: The COVID-19 Vaccine Is Here!
 - All New Yorkers age 16 and older are now <u>eligible</u> for the vaccine. While the
 vaccination process is underway, New Yorkers should continue to wear a mask, social
 distance, avoid large gatherings and follow all other health guidelines.
 - FDA fact sheets for recipients and caregivers on each vaccine are available: <u>Pfizer</u>; <u>Moderna</u>; <u>Johnson & Johnson</u>.
 - COVID vaccines are widely available at pharmacies, local health departments, clinics, Federally Qualified Health Centers and other locations across the state.
 Visit <u>Vaccines.gov</u> to find appointments near you or contact your local pharmacy or provider.
 - To schedule an appointment directly at a New York State-run site, go to <u>New York</u>
 <u>State's vaccine scheduler</u> and follow the instructions. Walk-in appointments are also accepted at New York State mass vaccination sites for all eligible adults.

II. Let's Get Vaccinated, BPC!

- In Battery Park City, there are now <u>three (3) locations</u> where you can make a vaccination appointment.
- Goldman Sachs, alongside American Express, has recently partnered with New York
 City and CVS Health to offer a COVID-19 vaccination program at the Conrad Hotel. All
 lower Manhattan residents and employees who meet the eligibility requirements are
 welcome to schedule appointments for the Pfizer vaccine.

Eligibility Requirements

In order to qualify for the COVID-19 vaccination program, individuals must be aged 16 years or over and be a resident of New York State OR work/study full-time in New York State.

Scheduling and Location Details

All who meet the eligibility requirements can schedule appointments on the New York City COVID-19 Vaccine Finder by selecting the Conrad Hotel location or use the following links.

- ✓ May 14th Clinic
- Appointments will be booked simultaneously for the first and second doses of the vaccine, and will take place in the Conrad Hotel at 225 Murray Street, which is accessible through the entrance in the alley, next to Bloom Florist.

III. Low-Cost COVID-19 Rapid Testing in BPC

- Low-cost rapid COVID testing available at Irish Hunger Memorial thru Sunday, May 9.
- o Available 8AM-6PM daily; \$25/test; schedule an appointment: nyrapidtests.com.
- Approximately 5,000 tests conducted to date.




V. We're Back! In-Person Programming for May & June


VII. Public Art Cleaning & Maintenance - ONGOING

IX. Spring Tree Planting - COMPLETE

- For spring planting season, BPCA last week replaced more than a dozen trees across the neighborhood, including those destroyed in Tropical Storm Isaias last August.
- Species include: Red Sunset Maple Acer rubrum 'Red Sunset'; Swamp White Oak Quercus bicolor; Willow Oak - Quercus phellos, and Honey Locust – Gleditsia triacanthos var. inermis


XII. Keep It Wild!


II. Historical Trauma And Cultural Healing In 2021
